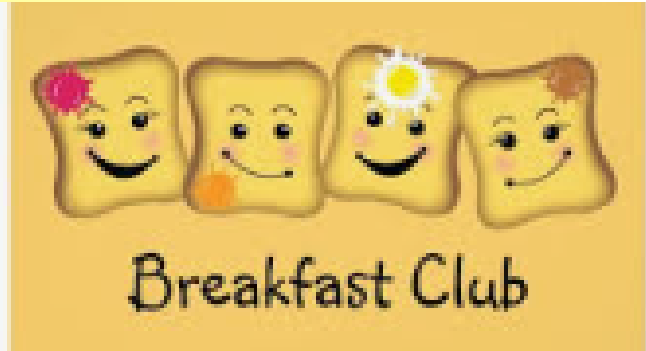

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about EMOJIS

Emojis are more than playful expressions — they form a fast-evolving digital language that many adults struggle to decode. For young people, this secret code is central to how they communicate identity, humour and emotions. With over 3 billion emojis sent daily on Facebook, Messenger, WhatsApp, and other social media apps, understanding these symbols is key to engaging meaningfully with digital youth.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

- GENERATIONAL MISCOMMUNICATION**
An emoji can be interpreted in multiple ways. For example, a face with a red tongue sticking out can be seen as playful or as a sign of anger. This can lead to misunderstandings and conflicts.
- SMELILING BULLYING OR PEER PRESSURE**
A smiling face with a single tear (😓) or a face with a hand over its mouth (😬) can be used to hide negative feelings or to mock someone who is crying.
- RAPIDLY SHIFTING MEANINGS**
The meaning of an emoji can change overnight. A face with a red tongue sticking out (😬) was once a sign of anger, but now it is often used to represent a face with a tongue sticking out.
- MASKING DISTRESS OR HARM**
A face with a red tongue sticking out (😬) can be used to mask distress or harm. A face with a hand over its mouth (😬) can be used to mask distress or harm.
- NORMALISING RISKY BEHAVIOURS**
A face with a red tongue sticking out (😬) can be used to normalise risky behaviours. A face with a hand over its mouth (😬) can be used to normalise risky behaviours.

Advice for Parents & Educators

- LEARN THE LINGO**
Stay updated with social media trends by using resources like the Wake Up Wednesday app or website. Encourage parents to learn basic emoji meanings when engaging with young people and help them identify potential risks.
- CREATE SAFE SPACES FOR DISCUSSION**
Encourage young people to share emojis, memes, and social media posts. Discuss the context and potential risks of using emojis in different situations.
- PRIORITISE TRUST OVER SURVEILLANCE**
Instead of trying to monitor every message, build a trusting relationship with young people. Encourage them to share their concerns and seek help when needed.
