See how far you can walk, cycle, run, scoot and wheel in just 6 weeks. There are great challenges to enjoy and prizes up for grabs.


The game will start on **Wednesday 25th March 2026** and end on **Wednesday 6th May 2026**.

If your child is interested in girls' football, please speak to Mrs Harrison or Mrs Baverstock about our every growing club.




